

Our Asian American Studies Brown Bag Workshop this month features a conversation with Rasel Ahmed, post-MFA artist with Department of Theater, Film, and Media Arts, The Ohio State University.



Rasel Ahmed is a community-based filmmaker who uses traditional cinematic tropes and techniques to combine documentary with fantasy. Characters in his films function as an anchor to synthesize the iconography, visual metaphor, and psychogeography of cinematic spaces. Ahmed's experimental videos are a means to explore his dialogical relationship with displacement, citizenship, border, and loneliness. He uses a combination of participatory documentation, archival research, and collaborative re-enactment to finalize the performance and movement choices in the film.

Ahmed has an MFA in Visual Arts with a concentration in Moving Image from Columbia University. He also runs a community-based transnational Queer archive and is the founder of Bangladesh's first LGBT magazine Roopbaan. He is the recipient of Freedom From Religion Foundation Award, Center Global Leadership Award, Atlas Corps Fellowship, Royal Commonwealth Society Associate Fellowship, Point Foundation Scholarship, GAAPA/Prism Foundation Scholarship, Davis-Putter Scholarship, Chinn Scholarship, Chowdhury Center Fellowship, Columbia University Visual Arts Scholarship, Swedish Institute Leadership Fellowship, and State Department's International Visitor Leadership Program.

CES Spring 2022 Student Travel and Research Grants

The Center for Ethnic Studies is pleased to announce its travel and research grants program for the 2021-2022 academic year!

CES awards a number of small grants every year to undergraduate and graduate students traveling to support their conference participation and research activities. For the Spring 2022 cycle, we are pleased to be able to partner with the ASC Center for Career and Professional Success to provide additional funding for grant recipients.

Eligibility Requirements:

All undergraduate or graduate students currently enrolled in coursework for the Spring 2022 term may apply. Proposals should demonstrate a substantial connection to one or more of the fields represented within the Center's academic programs: American Indian Studies, Asian American Studies, and/or Latina/o Studies, with preference given to those enrolled in our minor and GIS Programs.

Complete applications will consist of the following:

- I. A completed online application form at Center for Ethnic Studies Student Travel and Research Grant Application Form | Center for Ethnic Studies (osu.edu).
- 2. Other documents, uploaded and attached to the electronic application form, including: a. a project description of 1200-1500 words (with accompanying title) including brief statements on how the grant would aid its development, how much work has already been done on the project and, if applicable, financial need caused by the impacts of the pandemic (**please note we are no longer requiring an accompanying bibliography**)
 - b.verification of IRB approval for the research project (if applicable) c.résumé or c.v.
- 3. **Please note that we are also no longer requiring a letter of support from the applicant's adviser or from a faculty member with whom the applicant has worked closely on the conference paper or research project, but if you still choose to request one, please have faculty address the letter to Nick Spitulski (spitulski.1@osu.edu), Center for Ethnic Studies, 455 Hagerty Hall, 1775 College Road.

Awards are competitive (i.e., reviewed by a selection committee) and will be decided on the basis of merit and the project's significance to the student's academic and/or professional development and the potential for the student's work to contribute to greater understanding of the field in which they are working. Please also note that previous award recipients are permitted to reapply for these grants, but that, all else equal, first-time applicants will receive priority consideration. Recipients shall submit a 500-word essay on the state of their research or some other aspect of the way they spent the funding that can be used as a news item on the CES website or in other CES materials, and a photo of either the recipient or some aspect of their project. **The deadline for grant proposals is Friday, March 25th, 2022**

Whole Health Strategies: Integrating Behavioral Health, Criminal Justice and Indigenous Culture for American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/AN).

Al/AN are over-represented in our Federal, State and local prisons and jails. While the understanding of trauma in our criminal justice system needs substantial development, the understanding of historical trauma, particularly as it impacts the Al/AN community, is minimal. Failed recovery and rehabilitation while in custody leads to re-incarceration and rippling negative impacts on the individual, family, and community. This webinar will help you develop strategies to incorporate indigenous culture into the recovery and rehabilitation process that may help decrease incarceration for Al/AN. The duration of the webinar is a day and half.

Audience: Staff who work with incarcerated AI/AN in criminal justice or behavioral health settings, in Tribal or urban communities; All who are interested in having the criminal justice and behavioral health systems better support and serve the needs of AI/AN individuals and communities; All who are interested in integrated health.

Speakers:

- Robert Yazzie, Chief Justice Emeritus of the Navajo Nation Supreme Court, will speak on Restorative Justice.
- Michael Yellow Bird, Ph.D., author of <u>Decolonizing Pathways Towards Integrative</u> <u>Healing in Social Work</u>, will speak about his work.
- Patti LaBoucane-Benson, author of <u>The Outside Circle</u> a valuable resource to anyone working with justice-system involving AI/AN.
- Five additional speakers, four panel discussions, and three presentations of traditional dance, music, and drumming.

Registration: Opening soon. This event will be free and open to all. Some sessions will be recorded and freely available online after the event.


