Live Bat Program

Bring the World of Bats to Your Classroom

Bats are one of the most important animals in our environment but many species face major threats to their survival. In this 30-45 minute **web-based** program with live bats, education specialists from the Organization for Bat Conservation will introduce your students to bats found around the world, the role they play in various ecosystems, and the threats causing population declines. Students can interact with the educator and ask questions. The program includes an in-class research and writing project for students to engage with the topic of White-nose Syndrome, the number one threat.

This **FREE** program is designed for 4th graders with at least 100 students participating. Large screen and Internet connection are necessary.
