# Call for Abstracts

# ALL ABSTRACTS WILL BE FOR POSTER PRESENTATIONS LIVE AT THE VIRTUAL

**MEETING.** Your poster session presentation time will be specified in the meeting agenda that will be sent to registrants prior to the meeting. We highly encourage professionals, students and researchers to submit abstracts for live, virtual poster presentations and be available at their assigned presentation times. **The deadline for abstract submission is Monday, March 1, 2021 at 5pm EST (4pm CST).** All presenters must register for the meeting. Abstracts should include name, organization, address of authors, and title. Underline the name of the author who will be presenting the paper. The Abstract should (1) state the principal objectives and scope of the investigation, (2) describe the methods employed (briefly), (3) summarize the results, and (4) state the principle conclusions. The abstract should be < 300 words.

Follow the format guidelines below when preparing your abstract (see example below):

- Title should be in all capital letters, bold, and centered at the top of the page.
- Include names and current addresses of authors after the title (and underline presenter's name).
- Italicize addresses of authors.
- Use 12-point Times New Roman font.
- Use 1-inch margins on all sides.
- Left justify authors and text only.

Email abstract submissions with subject line labeled "2021 MWBWG abstract" with attachment of abstract in Microsoft Word format to **BOTH:** <u>Dr. Allen Kurta</u> (akurta@emich.edu) & <u>Dr. Joe Johnson (jjohnson@ohio.edu)</u>.

## Poster Guidelines

- Overall size should be 12x9 inches
- Title should be capitalized with lettering around 32-point font
- Authors and affiliations should be in upper- and lower-case around 20-point font
- Text lettering should be at least 14-point font
- Most posters should include the following sections: Abstract, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion, Conclusions, Literature Cited
- Keep written text to a minimum. "Bullets" and short phrases are most effective
- Gather.town (virtual link to come) will be open 24 hours prior to the meeting for familiarization of the virtual space and for you to practice with a friend.
- **Posters will be due March 26, 2021** (submission instructions to follow upon abstract acceptance)
