# Fall Workshop

Why Reading for High-Ability Learners?

Approximately 50%-70% of tradional readingmaterial could be eliminated for academically talented students. (National Research Center on the Gifted and Talented)



This workshop reviews the purposes and methods of reading instruction, with a focus on developmentally-appropriate needs of highability readers. Topics include genres of literature, enriched and accelerated reading curricula, and the role of reading in the social and emotional development of gifted students.
