Registration

To participate in endorsement classes, you must register one time each year with [Distance and Online Education](#) as a non-degree seeking student; for the State of Iowa Endorsement in Talented and Gifted Education, you may register as either a graduate or undergraduate student regardless of your professional status (if you won't benefit in other ways from the graduate credit, you can save tuition dollars. Once you have your HawkID and password, you can follow the directions to register for the courses that interest you the most (belinblank.org/educators/reg).

Research in the field of gifted education has consistently shown that teachers require a particular combination of knowledge, dispositions and skills in order to work effectively with gifted students (Rowan & Townend, 2016).

President Theodore Roosevelt said that Chautauqua is “the most American thing in America” (“Chautauqua,” 2023). An adult education and social movement in the early 1900s, Chautauqua spread throughout America, especially in rural areas.

The BelinBlank.org/Chautauqua provides 6 courses (6 semester hours) in the summer, allowing you to choose 1 or 2 classes—or all 6. What works for you and your needs?

Those registered as graduate students who enroll in all 3 classes in either week receive a full scholarship for the cost of 1 of the 3 classes. Those who enroll in all 6 classes receive a full scholarship for 2 of the 6.

Meet in person or via Zoom for the first 2 days of each class, then finish up each class over three weeks. Six semester hours = half of the endorsement (sufficient for conditional endorsement).
