



REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS: 2014 FRAMEWORK FACULTY FELLOW

The Framework Faculty Fellowship funds learning collaborations between faculty and students to support the advancement of [the One Ohio State Framework Plan](#). The One Ohio State Framework Plan is based on the belief that the academic mission must shape the physical environment of the university across all six campuses. The Framework Faculty Fellow will reach out to faculty, staff, and students across all six campuses to develop learning opportunities that advance the Framework Plan and the university's strategic academic mission.

The Framework Faculty Fellow, reporting to the Office of Academic Affairs, will:

- serve as the interface for Framework-related projects that lend themselves to research, problem-based, service, or living learning opportunities;
- lead a research, problem-based, service, or living learning based experience focused on some aspect of the Framework plan appropriate to their disciplinary/interdisciplinary interests;
- develop a small grant program to support faculty in learning opportunities that engage with the campus. Examples could include:
 - Proposals for investment in civic infrastructure such as storm water management, transportation, parkland, the Olentangy River corridor, or wayfinding for visitors;
 - Initiatives to enhance the campus experience;
 - Supporting data-informed decision making through assessments of campus conditions such as water quality, safety, energy use, or location of food service;
 - Tools to communicate key features of campus such as public art, sustainable buildings and landscapes, or accessible routes;
 - and additional areas to be identified by the Fellow;
- interact with academic units, Physical Planning and Real Estate (PPARE), Facilities, Development and Construction (FDC), and others to support those projects;
- serve as the day-to-day contact for learning projects engaged with the Framework plan.

QUALIFICATIONS: The ideal candidate will be a full-time faculty member that has a balanced record of teaching and research, a documented record of teaching research, problem-based, or service-learning courses, demonstrated team-building skills, and experience in outreach and engagement. Experience with the Framework plan, campus-based projects, or living-learning projects is desired.

SUPPORT: The faculty fellow will be appointed on a part-time basis for one year. The percent time and effort assigned to the Office of Academic Affairs and the responsibility for salary and benefits will be negotiated between the Office of Academic Affairs and the faculty fellow's home unit. This position will include funding to support projects, as well as administrative support.

- A cover letter, or no more than two pages, describing
 - a research, problem-based, service, or living learning experience you would plan to lead as the Framework Faculty Fellow;
 - how you have used research, problem-based, service or living learning experiences in the past;
 - your experience in outreach and engagement.
- A current CV
- A letter of support from your academic unit head/chair

Selection of the fellow is expected by the end of the fall semester with the appointment expected to begin in January.
